Car Seat Checklist for Parents

Common and dangerous errors:

1. Unsafe used seat (rusty, cracked, broken, bent, over 10 years old, unknown crash history).
2. Infant facing the front of the car (babies should face the rear until 20 lbs. and 12 months old).
3. Baby too big for small, infant-only seat (over 18-20 lbs. or head above the top edge of the seat).
4. Child too small for the seat (shield in front of infant's neck or face; child under 30-40 lbs. in booster).
5. Harness straps loose on the child or not threaded correctly (read instructions).
6. Harness straps on the arms or under the arms (straps go over shoulders, usually need clip on chest).
7. Overhead shield (if there is one) not connected to the harness.
8. Buckle not firmly locked (listen for the "click").
9. Car seat on recall list (call one of the numbers listed on the back to find out how to order free parts).
10. Booster used with only a lap belt (either a shield or a shoulder/lap belt must be used).
11. Vehicle safety belt not attached to the car seat (the seat could crush the child in a crash).
12. Safety belt loose (check tightness by pulling the top of the car seat toward front of car, then sideways).
13. Safety belt placed in the wrong slot (read and follow instructions exactly).
14. Too many people in the car (there must be one safety belt per person).
15. Other (a rear-facing infant must ride in the back seat if there is a passenger-side air bag in the front; automatic/passive safety belts cannot be used for car seats; if the buckle for the vehicle belt is too far forward, it may not hold the car seat in place. Read vehicle owner's manual for possible solutions.)
