Non-Emergency Calls:

There are two ways of contacting the LAPD for a non-emergency situation. From landline (non cellular) type telephone you can call 311 and ask for police dispatch. If you are calling from a cellular telephone, dial 1-877-ASK_LAPD or 1-877-275-5273. This leads us to the question: "What is considered a non-emergency call?"

A non-emergency call is a situation where a person's life and property is NOT in immediate danger. Included under this definition are crimes against property, crimes against persons where the victim is not injured and situations in which the offenders are not at or near the scene, however, a police officer is needed to respond, investigate and take a report.

Examples of Non-Emergency Calls

- 1. Smashed doors or windows in unoccupied homes or stores.
- 2. Abandoned cars on the street.
- 3. Persons loitering near a school.
- 4. Information and/or rumors of an impending crime.
- 5. Persistent anonymous phone calls.
- 6. Suspicious looking persons following your moves while shopping or on your way home.
- 7. Late discovery of crimes against persons or property.

Information the operator will want to know:

- 1) A description of the incident you are reporting. (What did you observe?)
- 2) The address or location of the incident you are reporting.
- 3) Your name, address and telephone number.
- 4) Number of persons involved.
- 5) Descriptions of the persons involved.
- 6) Direction taken by the escaping suspects.
- 7) Is suspect in a vehicle or on foot?
- 8) Plate number and description of vehicle.
- 9) Other details and circumstances.

If you are concerned about being identified, please tell the operator that you wish to be contacted by phone only. The responding officers may need additional information from you. If you remain completely anonymous (no name and phone number), it severely restricts the action that officers are able to take. In some cases, remaining anonymous means that we can not take any legal action at all.

While your Senior Lead Officers are happy to help with problems in your area, we are not always available to respond to incidents as they occur. If you need the Police to respond to an incident, please call the above numbers.

Senior Lead Officer Jericho (Jerry) Velasquez has returned to the office from his military deployment. We welcome him back to West Valley and thank him for his service to our country.

Mayor Villaraigosa and Councilman Zine, among many others attended the Grand Opening of the Lanark Park pool. "Operation Splash" will be offering swimming lessons through Sept 3rd.

Crime and Arrest Information.

Just a snapshot of some of the hard work that LAPD officers did last month in West Valley Division.

- West Valley Senior Lead Officers worked a second Illegal Vendor Task Force with Public Works, Building and Safety, Health Department, and Sanitation, resulting in 12 arrests.
- Gang Officers made an excellent arrest of 4 Canoga Park gang members for an Assault with a Deadly Weapon / Hate Crime that occurred near Lanark Park.
- Gang Officers also arrested a juvenile (14) near Reseda and Sherman Way after he "borrowed" his father's car without dad's knowledge or permission.
- Vice Officers made Prostitution arrests near Winnetka / Ventura and Reseda / Valerio.
- Property Crimes Officers arrested 2 people near Fallbrook and Ventura with narcotics, false identification, and a stolen check.
- Motel Task Force Officers made an arrest from a Burglary from Vehicle crime that occurred in the 18300 block of Burbank Bl. They were able to recover the victim's wallet, credit cards, and identification.
- Patrol Officers made numerous arrests including (just a few):

A male for Residential Burglary near Sherman Way and Desoto,

A male for Stolen Property (checks) and Narcotics at Lindley and Hart

A female for Driving under the Influence at Oxnard and Owensmouth

A male for Driving under the Influence at Sherman Way and Lindley

A male for Driving under the Influence after a collision at Mason and Sherman Way

2 males (stopped on a traffic violation) for narcotics, possession of a gun, and warrants near Reseda and Valerio.
