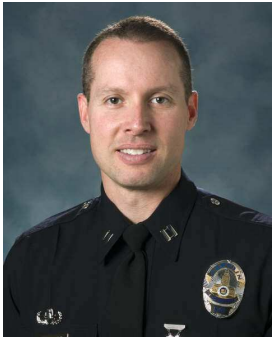


Captain Justin Eisenberg's Captain's Corner:



I'd like to take a moment to remind everyone of the importance of the security of yourselves and your loved ones. Bicycle theft is a growing problem in our community, and with some simple steps, this problem can be combated. First, a high quality steel U-lock from a

reputable manufacturer is one of the best defenses against bicycle theft. If such a lock is used properly – securing the bicycle tightly to a bike rack, or similarly mounted solid object bolted to the ground – it makes

your bicycle a “hardened target,” and bike thieves are likely to move on to easier pickings. Also, registering your bike at NationalBikeRegistry.com is a great way to ensure that if your bicycle is ever lost or stolen, it can be returned to you.

Crime Briefing

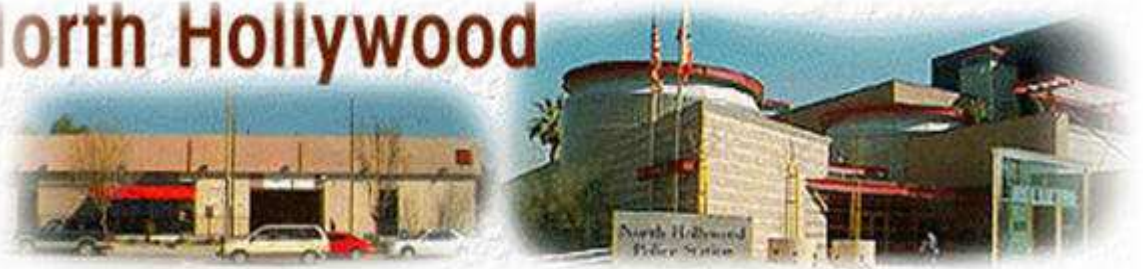
Part I Crimes, which are a combination of all violent and property crimes, are down 6.3 percent year to date.

Violent crimes are down 16 percent for 2012. This includes a 26 percent reduction in robberies and 3 percent reduction in aggravated assaults.

Property crimes are down 4 percent, which includes a 16 percent reduction in burglaries. We are currently up 2.1 percent in Burglary Theft from Motor Vehicles and 4 percent in other thefts.

Crime Prevention Tips

Due to an increase in bicycle related accidents, we are providing the following statistical information:

From January 1, 2012 through July 26, 2012 there were a total of **71** reported Vehicle vs. Bicycle collisions:

(43) incidents involved the bicycle being at fault, for a total of 61% at fault rate for bicycles.

(17) of the collisions involved the car being at fault, for a total of 23% at fault rate for cars.

(11) were party "X", meaning that no party was determined to be solely at fault. This category comprised 15% of the total bicycle involved collisions. (If you don't count party "X" reports, bicycles were at fault 72% of the time, cars 28% of the time).

Other North Hollywood Area Bicycle Statistics:

(28) of the primary collision factors were for bicyclists riding in the wrong direction on the roadway.

(4) accidents were caused by car doors being opened.

(3) accidents involved "Fixie" bicycles with no brakes. They were all listed "At Fault."

(1) accident was bicycle vs. bicycle.

Now that school is back in session, please discuss bicycle safety with your children. Remember,

bicyclists have to obey the rules of the road just like motorists and always wear protective head gear.

For theft prevention, keep your bicycle serial numbers on file as well as a photograph of your bike in the event it is stolen. Never leave your bicycle unattended, even for a couple of minutes without securing it.

Current Crime Trends

During this period, there was an increase in robberies, residential burglaries and Grand Theft Auto. There was a decrease in Burglary Theft from Motor Vehicles and aggravated assaults. A small crime cluster was concentrated in the area of Lankershim Boulevard and Kittridge Street. Please remember to **Lock It, Hide It, Keep It**, whenever you park your vehicle. Most of the crime in this cluster were vehicles being broken into to take personal property, usually visible.

Current Crime Trends

Overall, Part I crimes decreased during the last period; however, residential burglary, Burglary Theft from Motor Vehicles and robberies increased. Theft (shoplifting) and Grand Theft Autos showed lower numbers than the previous reporting period. Highest concentration occurrences of Part I crimes remained in the major thoroughfares, i.e., Sherman Way and Coldwater Canyon Boulevard (between Sherman Way and Vanowen Street). Gang related crimes (with the exception of two robberies) remain low, which can be directly attributed to North Hollywood Area gang personnel conducting proactive enforcement against three documented gangs.

Coldwater Canyon Elementary, Saticoy Elementary and Madison Middle Schools have started their school year; Valley Traffic Division, Los Angeles School Police and Senior Lead Officers (SLO) are working

on possible long-term solutions to the grid-lock pedestrian and vehicular traffic problem when schools let out.

Remember during the excessive heat warnings to check on the welfare of elderly neighbors and keep your pets cool with plenty of shade and water.

Current Crime Trends

During this crime extraction period, robbery, Grand Theft Auto and burglary experienced an increase; however, the usual number one Part I crime of Burglary Theft from Motor Vehicles decreased. Several of the businesses have been contacted to conduct extra private patrol and preventive measures to assist with reducing this crime occurrence. 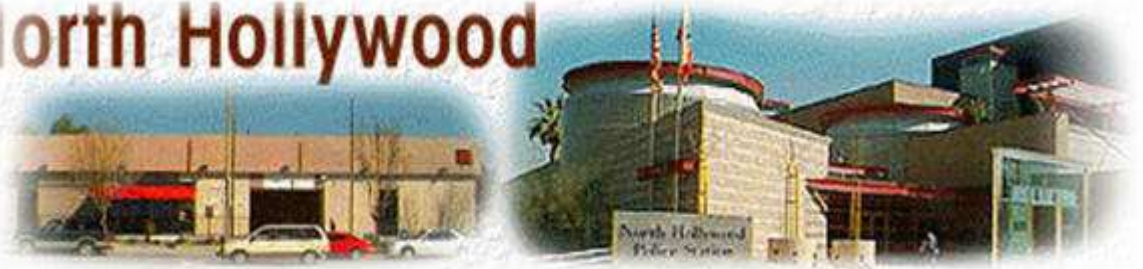

During this period, the number one crime was aggravated assaults, with an overall decrease in Part I crime categories. Patrol have concentrated on possible connections to parole and probation individuals in an effort to keep crime categories such

as robbery and burglary reduced. These efforts have paid off with recent arrests during compliance checks. Additionally, SLO and Valley Traffic Division have diligently enforced the illegal mobile trailers observed throughout the Valley Village area through impounds and citations.

Current Crime Trends

During this crime period, aggravated assault was the only category to increase; significantly, all other property crime occurrences decreased. Theft from Motor Vehicle incidents dropped dramatically, which can be attributed to the community members being diligent in keeping their personal property out of sight and vehicles locked. **Lock It, Hide It, Keep It!** Problematic businesses have continued to be targeted for after-hours activity which has generated general and public nuisance issues.

Current Crime Trends

The last crime period experienced an unusual increase in sexual assault and aggravated assault, which is not characteristic to the Area. The sexual assault incidents have been investigated to reveal no patterns or habitual suspects. Also, many of the crimes against persons can be attributed to domestic violence occurrences, and not random suspects preying on innocent victims.

Fryman Park experienced an increase in vehicles being broken into for visible personal property. As a result, the Area conducted surveillance and undercover operations in hopes of identifying possible serial suspects and conducting proactive prevention efforts. **Lock It, Hide It, Keep It.**
